Waunakee High School seniors will be going door to door to raise funds for scholarships to help with tuition.

Four high school seniors told the Waunakee Rotary Club about the Waunakee High School Scholarship Committee at its April 3 meeting.

Most of the senior class ventures out to homes and businesses seeking donations. The scholarships are then distributed to every college-bound senior who worked on the drive.

The scholarships are very important for students who attend an out-of-state university and some of the in-state universities. Three of the four seniors said they planned to attend UW-Milwaukee.

Last year, each participating senior received about \$220 to help defray the cost of tuition. The checks are made out directly to the college.

Nearly 300 seniors are in this year's graduating class, and they will be knocking on doors April 16.

The Rotary Club also held club assembly.

The fund-raising committee reported that James Chancellor is the new chair of the Waunafest Committee. He will need some help with the undertaking. The Oktoberfest is the next event, and Dan Muxfeld and Ben Ballweg will chair that event. The club also expects to bring back the Super Bowl Sunday event next year.
