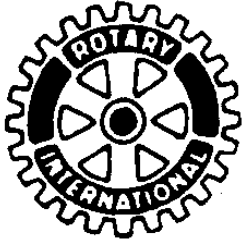

Jim Batman of Jim Batman and Associates spoke to the Waunakee Rotary Dec. 15 about different styles of behavior.

Jim has been in the training field for 20 years, working with couples, school districts, sales conventions, trade shows and other places.

Everyone has an element of dominant, expressive, analytical and amiable behavior patterns. But people live mostly with one or two of those behaviors.

Almost all conflict is the result of personality differences, Jim said. In fact, he believes that more prejudice is based on personality differences than on any other basis.

Jim believes that students and teachers will do better in school if they understand the different personality patterns and how to deal with them. That kind of understanding enhances people skills which also serve students as they enter the work world.

Jim estimates that 60-70 percent of people believe they marry people with opposite patterns of interaction – and the trait that they fall in love with tends to become the one they despise the most.
