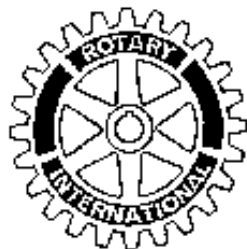

The Waunakee Rotary Club held club assembly at the June 1 meeting.

At the May 31 board of directors meeting, the board voted to provide \$150 to the Waunakee fastpitch team, \$200 to Badger Camp, \$250 for the St. John's Parish Mission and \$500 to the Project Linus quilt effort, President Greg Garton reported.

The board also voted in Brent Ziegler as a new member.

Greg asked that members fill out the survey provided by the fellowship committee.

The committee chairs then provided reports:

- Service Committee – Larry Felsheim reported that the bridge at the Castle Creek Conservancy was coming along with beams donated by Endres Manufacturing. The club may have a work day coming up there. Larry urged members to participate in Service Club Olympics July 24-25 and said the meal is fantastic. There is also a work day June 14 at 5 p.m. at Rotary Plaza.

- Programs/Public Relations – Jim Tubbs reported that speakers are scheduled for the meetings through July 13. - International – Lori Derauf said the sewing project is in the final stage with funds to be sent to Peru. They committee may also look at a well project, possibly for Haiti. The Russians are also coming again. And Thursday, June 8, members are picking up school supplies from Prairie Elementary to be sent to Honduras at about 1:30 p.m. In July, they'll have a party to sort the supplies for shipping.
