



# Waunakee Rotary Foundation 2019 Service to Humanity Scholarship Application

## Description

The Waunakee Rotary Foundation awards four \$1,500 Service to Humanity Scholarships annually to graduating high school seniors who provide exemplary volunteer or community service.

## Eligibility Requirements

- High school seniors in good standing residing in the Waunakee Community School District graduating from Waunakee High School, Edgewood High School, Madison Country Day School, St. Ambrose Academy, or a homeschool.
- Seniors awarded scholarships must be registered as full time students (12 credit hours minimum) at an accredited university, college or technical school in the Fall of 2019.
- Children of Waunakee Rotary Members are not eligible due to certain tax regulations.
- Scholarship recipients are required to attend the Waunakee Rotary Club meeting held at Rex's Innkeeper on Thursday, June 6, 2019, from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. You and your parents will be our guests during the lunch meeting and you will briefly address the club.

## Application Requirements

1. **Complete the attached Application Form and submit all required documents by April 11, 2019. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.**
2. Include one recommendation letter from a volunteer or community service supervisor specific to this scholarship. A college application letter of recommendation will not be accepted as a recommendation letter for this scholarship.
3. On separate single sided sheets of paper provide the following information typed in 12 point font:
  - a. The Rotary International 2018-2019 Presidential theme is *Rotary: Be the Inspiration*. Write an essay between 500 and 1,500 words describing how and why you can be the inspiration to those that you help through your volunteer or community service.
  - b. List two extra-curricular school or community activities other than your volunteer or community service. In 250 words or less, describe how you benefited from these activities and how this could help you in the future.
  - c. List two high school classes. In 250 words or less, describe what you learned and how this will help you in college or with your future career.
  - d. Which university, college or technical school are you planning to attend and what is your anticipated area of study, major or career goal?
